WORLD SCOUT CENTRE & NATIONAL EXHIBITION

World Scout Centre is informative part of the Jamboree Programme, Though visiting each tent, Scouts will be able to learn more about the cultures, the ways of life, people of the world.



The aim of the World Scout Centre is to help participant to:

- . explore different parts of the world in a wide range of ways - social, cultural, geographical.
- . discover and respect the differences and similarities of each country and culture.
- . develop an interest in international Scouting.

The main functions are as follows:

1. Overseas Contingent Headquarters

All Overseas Contingent Headquarters will be located at the World Scout Centre and Contingent leaders will be assigned there for communication and co-ordination during the Jamboree.

2. Introduction of participating countries and their Scouting activities

All Overseas Contingents are requested to exhibit materials, which can show traditional and unique culture and Scouting. Panel and necessary equipments will be provided to all contingents.

3. Introduction of Scout activities around the world

The Scout Association of Japan (SAJ) will invite staff of World Scout Bureau and 6 Regional Staff/Committee members. They will introduce World Scouting at the centre.

4. Introduction of commemorative activities of the 50th anniversary of the Asia-Pacific Region

Since the Asia-Pacific Region(APR) celebrates its 50th anniversary this year, APR staff will introduce the history of APR and various commemorative activities such as APR Special Activity Badge.

5. Introduction of Scouting in Japan

(1) Introduction of the World Centenary activities in Japan

As the World Scout Movement celebrates its centenary in 2007, commemorative activities in Japan (Gift for Peace, Scouting Sunrise, Fuji Challenge Camp, etc.) will be introduced.

(2) Introduction of International Youth Programme

International Youth Programme organized by Rover Scouts will be introduced to raise awareness of international Scouting among participants.

(3) Introduction of the SAJ's activities to expand the organization

Venture Scout activities and programmes in Japan will be introduced to raise awareness of Venture Scouting among participants.

6. The 3rd Asia-Pacific Region (APR) Air Internet Jamboree

As a Scout event for the Asia-Pacific Region hosted by the Scout Association of Japan, exchanges with Scouts around the world will be promoted via amateur radio and the Internet.

7. Stage performance

Overseas Contingents are requested to make a performance such as traditional / cultural demonstrations, folk dances, songs or games of your country on the stage at the World Scout Centre.

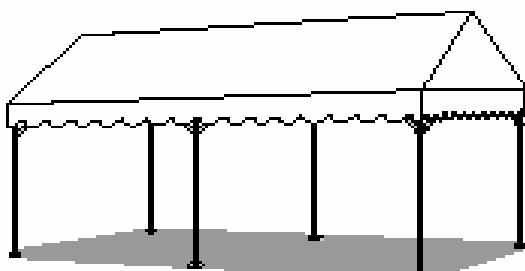

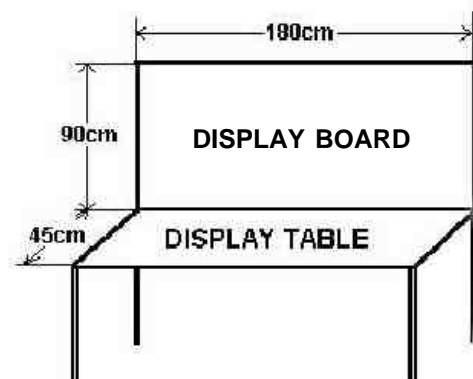

- (3) Information on national Scouting (posters, publications, badges, uniform, major events past and coming, etc.)

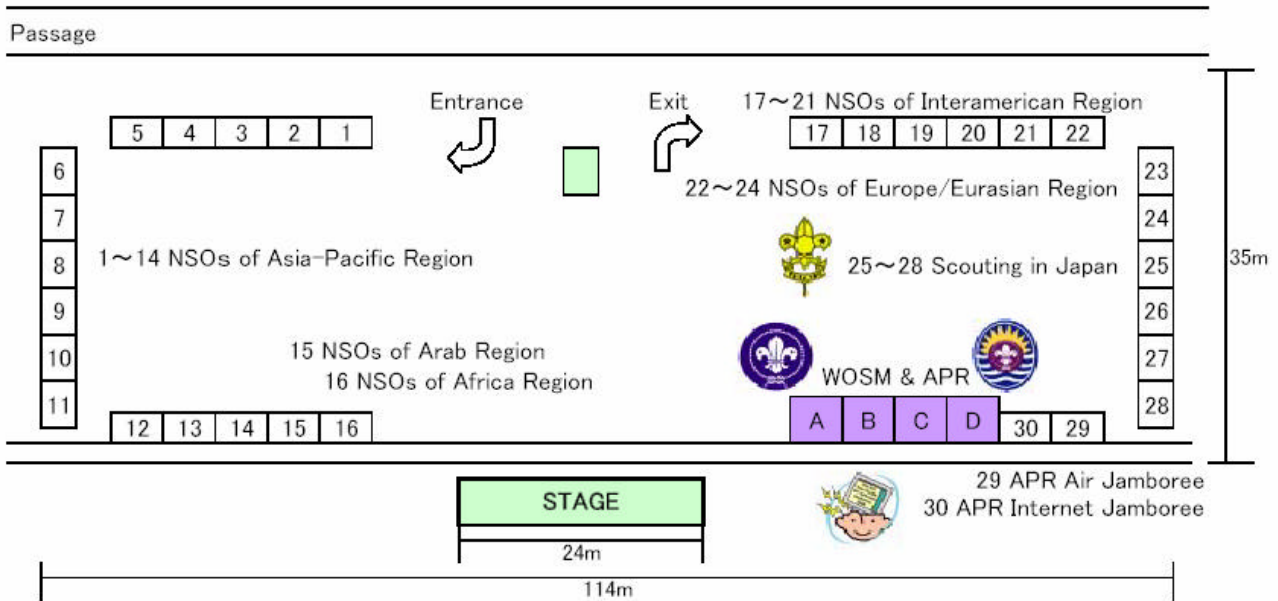
Political issues are not accepted to exhibit.

SUB-CAMP ASSIGNMENT (as of 4 July)

Overseas participants will be assigned to Sub-Camps (SC). In the case of a contingent consists of several participating Troops, that will be assigned to different SCs.

At each SC, Scouts will be assigned to each Japanese Host Troop as a form of two or three Scouts. Leaders of Overseas Contingents will be either assigned to Japanese Host Troops or SC headquarters. Leaders are responsible to keep communications with their own Scouts in their SC, and introduce their Scouting and culture at the World Scout Centre.

More than 1,000 applicants from 39 countries / territories will participate in the Jamboree, so that about 100 to 120 overseas Scouts and leaders will be assigned to the following SCs.

EQUIPMENT (Reminder)

Participants should bring their personal camping equipment. Japanese Host Troop will provide tents, cooking gears and heavy camping equipment.

What to bring

Overseas Participants are requested to bring the following personal camping equipments.

- Scout uniform
- underwear (pants, socks etc)
- t-shirts and jeans or trousers
- sweatshirts or pullovers (it can get cool at night)
- swimming wear
- rainwear
- hat, cap or material to cover your head (it can get very hot during the day)
- lightweight jacket
- towels
- eating utensils (plate, bowl, cutlery etc.), water bottle
- sleeping bag
- flashlight
- sun glasses
- sun block cream
- toiletry goods

PARTICIPATION IN PROGRAMMES

Overseas Scouts will participate in Jamboree programmes as members of patrols of the Japanese Host Troops to which they are assigned.

When overseas Scouts will participate in the excursions (off-site programmes), they will not be requested to pay the additional cost. The Scout Association of Japan will bear the cost for Overseas Scouts.

PARTICIPATION IN THE WHOLE CAMP ACTIVITIES

Overseas Scouts may temporarily leave the troops to which they are assigned in order to participate in the whole camp activities (opening ceremony, Jamboree grand arena show, and closing ceremony) as members of overseas contingents, depending on the nature of the events.

RECEPTION FOR OVERSEAS CONTINGENT

Welcome reception for overseas contingents to be hosted by the Jamboree President will be held on Friday 4 August, at 14:00-15:30 at Suzu Beach Hotel near Jamboree site. Each overseas contingent leader will be invited to the Reception. Each Contingent will receive Jamboree souvenir plaque.

WORSHIP SERVICE

On Saturday, 5 August at 9:00 a.m., Worship Services are to be conducted by major religious organizations. The locations will be informed in the Jamboree Guidebook.

You may join own faith group, not necessarily to stay with your assigned troop for worship service.

Morning prayer will be arranged by respective religions on 4, 6 & 7 August.

CURRENCY(Reminder)

Only Japanese currency "Yen" can be used inside Japan. Operation hours of bank service (US dollars to Japanese yen) at the headquarters of Jamboree Trading Post near JHQ area will be as follows.

Friday, 4 August – Sunday, 6 August 13:00 - 16:00

Overseas participants are strongly recommended to have a suitable amount of spending money changed at city banks before camp in. Credit cards are not acceptable.
