

14th NIPPON JAMBOREE – 2006

SCOUT ASSOCIATION OF JAPAN BASIC INFORMATION

DATES

Thursday, 3 August to Monday, 7 August 2006
Camp in: Thursday, 3 August
Camp out: Tuesday, 8 August

VENUE

Campsite of “Refresh Village Hachigasaki”,
Suzu-city, Ishikawa Prefecture, some 430km
northeast of Osaka and some 620km northwest of
Tokyo.

ATTENDANCE

22,000 Scouts and leaders from all over Japan
including some 600 Scouts/Guides and leaders from
other countries.

ELIGIBILITY

The Jamboree programmes are designed for both
male and female Scouts aged 12-15, and
Venture/Senior Scouts aged 15-18 may take part in as
the Service Corps. However, Scouts/Guides aged 15
to 18 from other National Scout/Guide Organizations
are welcome to challenge the Jamboree programmes
with younger Japanese Scouts.
Scouts/Guides and leaders from other countries must
be registered as members of their own National
Scout/Guide Organizations and their application
must be approved by their National Scout/Guide
Organizations.

CLIMATE AT THE JAMBOREE

Generally good with some rains.
Average temperature at the Jamboree site on August
in the past 5 years has been 25.3 (the minimum
14.1 and the maximum 37.8).

CAMP FEE

To be notified later (approx. JYE26,000 (equivalent
to US\$240) per person)
The fee covers rations for 15 meals starting from
dinner on August 3 and programs during the camp.

Other expenses, like transportation from Narita
International Airport or other ports of entry to the
Jamboree site, and cost of touring Japan excepting
for the home hospitality period, are responsibilities
of overseas contingents.

Participants should bring personal camping
equipment including sleeping bag, rain-wear,
swimming trunks, eating kit and flash-light.
Tents and cooking utensils are provided for overseas
participants.

HOME HOSPITALITY

Before or after the camp, overseas contingents will
be offered home hospitality on request, for maximum
of 3 days.

Every possible assistance in making your sightseeing
tours pleasant and economical will be extended to
overseas contingents.
